**Subject** **Public Services Ombudsman for Wales - Consultation on revised Code of Conduct Guidance**

**Purpose** To consider the draft revised Guidance prepared by the Ombudsman in relation to the Members Code of Conduct.

**Summary** The Public Services Ombudsman for Wales (PSOW) is consulting on proposed changes to the Guidance on the Members Code of Conduct, both in relation to City Councillors and Community Councils. The revised draft Guidance was circulated for comment in February 2021 with an extended closing date for consultation responses by 21<sup>st</sup> March. For the most part, the changes simply update the previous Guidance to provide further practical examples of breaches of the Code, based on previous cases investigated by the PSOW and determined by Standards Committees and Case Tribunals

## **Background**

1. The Public Services Ombudsman for Wales (PSOW) is consulting on proposed changes to the Guidance on the Members Code of Conduct, both in relation to City Councillors and Community Councils.
2. The revised draft Guidance was circulated for comment in February 2021 with an extended closing date for consultation responses by 21<sup>st</sup> March. Copies of the draft Guidance are attached to this report.
3. Because of the deadline for consultation responses, copies of the draft guidance were circulated to all members of Standards Committee on 10<sup>th</sup> February 2021 and members were invited to send any written comments by e-mail. No specific comments were received at the time.
4. In addition, copies of the revised Guidance in relation to Community Councillors was circulated to all Clerks of local community councils in February 2021. Again, no specific comments were received at that time.
5. For the most part, the changes simply update the previous Guidance to provide further practical examples of breaches of the Code, based on previous cases investigated by the PSOW and determined by Standards Committees and Case Tribunals.
6. The current Members Code of Conduct dates back to 2008 and was last revised in 2016. Therefore, Welsh Government and the WLGA are reviewing the current code prior to the next local government elections in May 2022. In addition, the WLGA are producing on-line training modules for new Councillors in relation to Ethical Standards, which will be rolled-out as part of the induction programme in May 2022. Training on the Code will, again, be mandatory for all elected members.
