


Newport City Council Air Quality Action Plan 2023-2028 Consultation

Newport City Council is responsible for monitoring air quality within its area. Where the council has identified air quality breaching air quality objectives (AQOs), which are the standard for different pollutants in Wales, it has set up Air Quality Management Areas (AQMAs). AQMAs have been set up in 11 locations across Newport for breaches of the nitrogen AQO and are shown geographically on the map below:



The 5 AQMAs based around M4 junctions (Glasllwch, High Cross, Shaftsbury, St Julians & Royal Oak Hill) have been below the AQO for over four years typically and will soon be revoked as a result of their improved air quality. These improvements appear to be due to a variety of reasons which may include the 50mph speed limit on the M4, an increase in home working post COVID, increased energy prices and a gradual change in the fleet composition towards cleaner, less polluting vehicles.

The remaining 6 AQMAs based around the localities of Caerleon, Caerphilly Road, Cefn Road, Chepstow Road, George Street and Malpas Road remain in place. All AQMAs in Wales must have an Air Quality Action Plan (AQAP) which provides guidance on how compliance with AQOs (which for these AQMAs is also nitrogen dioxide) could be achieved.

The Council's latest AQAP is now in draft form and contains a range of potential measures for each AQMA. These measures have been proposed as a result of discussions with local air quality action groups, which the council has set up in each of the six AQMAs. The groups bring together local residents and interested stakeholders to help improve air quality in the AQMA.

At the end of 2022, air quality in Newport was observed to be compliant with air quality standards across its remaining six AQMAs. Where measures continue to be adopted the revocation of these AQMAs may be possible as early as 2025 if levels continue their trend.

The following table is annotated to provide examples of the measures that can and are being employed:

Glossary of Terms

Abbreviation	Description
Active Travel (AT)	Clean / healthy alternatives to using transportation which produces emissions e.g., walking, cycling, electric buses.
Air Quality Action Plan	A plan produced where an AQMA has been declared. This explains what measures can be adopted within AQMAs to reduce prevailing emissions to compliance with an air quality objective.
Air Quality Objective	The limit level for an atmospheric pollutant set by Government for which compliance is sought e.g. 40ug/m3 for NO2 annually.
AQAP	Air Quality Action Plan - A detailed description of measures, outcomes, achievement dates and implementation methods, showing how the local authority intends to achieve air quality limit values'
AQMA	Air Quality Management Area – An area where air pollutant concentrations exceed / are likely to exceed the relevant air quality objectives. AQMAs are declared for specific pollutants and objectives
EV	Electric vehicle.
Green walls/ Infrastructure	Plantings and park areas within urban and sub urban areas. Some may be specifically provided for air quality benefits.
Street Canyon	Regions where continuous buildings on each side of a road form a canyon within which pollutants can build up before being dispersed.
Transport Emissions	Emissions from road traffic. Railway and Air transport is not included.
ULEV	Ultra low emissions vehicle.
